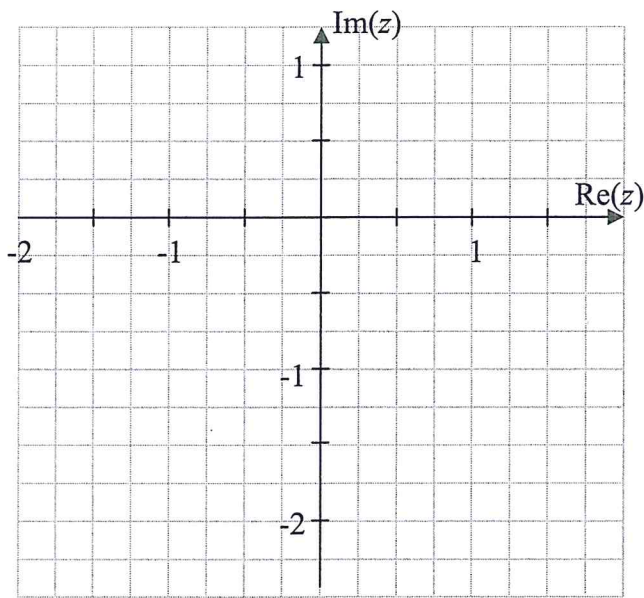
Answer **all six** questions from this section.

Question 1 **(25 marks)**

$z = \frac{4}{1 + \sqrt{3}i}$ is a complex number, where $i^2 = -1$.

(a) Verify that z can be written as $1 - \sqrt{3}i$.

(b) Plot z on an Argand diagram and write z in polar form.



(c) Use De Moivre's theorem to show that $z^{10} = -2^9(1 - \sqrt{3}i)$.

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
